Getting to School:

Buses

Students are able to catch a variety of local bus and coach services to and from the school. Beenleigh SHS has a bus shelter located inside of the school gates adjacent to the bus bay. Staff members supervise the gate access to the bus bay each afternoon. The gates located at the bus bay are only for use by students that are catching buses. Student pedestrian access through these gates is restricted and students walking home must leave via the front school gates.

Trains

Beenleigh SHS is located approximately 500m from Beenleigh Train Station. Students catching trains are advised to arrive to and leave the school via the side school gates on the train station side of the school. These gates are unlocked at approximately 7.30am and are unlocked at 2.45pm.



Bikes, Scooters and Skateboards

Students that ride bikes, scooters, skateboards or similar transport items are able to do so if they lock these items in the transport cage located at the front side of the main entry gates. This cage is locked at 8.40am and reopened at 2.45pm. The cage also houses a number of bike racks if students wish to provide their own extra secure locks. Students arriving late to school or leaving early are able to ask the friendly office staff to unlock the cage to allow transport to be locked up or retrieved.

Arriving Late

- If a student arrives after 9.00am, they are to sign in at the Student Service Entry (Late Arrivals & Early Departures) which is located at the front of the Admin building across from the carpark.
- Students will be given a late slip to attend class.
- Unexplained lateness will result in a Lunch One Detention.

Leaving Early and Signing Out

- The office must be notified before 11.00am of student/s early departure on (07) 3442 3750, email absent@beenleighshs.eq.edu.au or bring in a signed note to the Student Service Entry.
- Students are to present to the Student Service Entry before school or at first break to receive their leave request slip.
- Students are to show their subject teacher their leave request slip at the beginning
 of the lesson. Students will be released from class at the approved time once their
 slip has been sighted. Students are not to be directly contacted via mobile as it
 causes disruption to learning and will not be allowed to leave class without their

Year 7 Students will be participating in an iPad program throughout their junior years (7-9) in all subjects. Every student will need an iPad to access the curriculum and get the most out of their learning.

HOW

Every year 7 Student will be issued with an iPad. This will be added much like school fees at a cost of tbc over three years. This device will be school managed and connected to the network with access to all the apps and programs essential for your child to succeed. Students will have the option to purchase devices at the end of the program for \$5.

WHAT

Students will be issued with the following:

- iPad

- Protective case with bluetooth keyboard
 - Tempered glass screen protector
 - Power pack and charging cable
 - Apps necessary for student work
 - Automatically updates and IT support

BSHS iPad Program FAQs - FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

Why does my student need an iPad?

More now than ever, IT is an essential part of education. In a world where IT is an essential skill for all students, no matter their future career path, digital literacies in schools are not only engaging, but an important way to build Students' work readiness for the 21st century.

Will my student need the device every day?

The iPad will be an integral part of your student's day to day learning. While time spent on the device each day may vary the iPad is an essential tool to support learning and engagement.

Can I provide my child with their own iPad?

Yes, students can use an iPad that they already own as long as it meets the requirements of the school. It must be a 9th generation device or newer with a Bluetooth keyboard and screen protector. This device will not be managed by the school and all apps required by the school will need to be purchased and installed privately. The school is also limited with the level of monitoring and security compared to school managed devices. It is advised that you book a meeting with the school to discuss this before proceeding.

Do I still need to participate in the Student Resource Scheme (SRS)?

Yes, students will continue to use pen and paper for some set tasks and other school equipment for practical activities. Students will also be provided online access to textbooks and other web-based resources.

Can you please explain the finances?

Significant efforts have been made to minimise costs and maximise access to devices to support learning. As the school purchased devices in bulk, we were able to keep costs lower whilst providing all the necessary tools for 21st century learning. Allowing students to pay off the device over a period of time minimises the financial impact on families and allows the school to fully manage the hired devices to give families a level of security. If you are having significant financial hardships, please make an appointment with the admin team to discuss the matter.

What do other schools do?

Beenleigh State High School differs from other schools in the region who require students to purchase devices outright before commencing the school year. We have done everything possible to minimise the financial burden on families whilst ensuring students still have access to state-of-the-art educational practices.


Why is there a fee for the device at the end?

For the device to continue to be school managed it must be hired out for the duration of the program. This allows the school to install apps, increase levels of security and monitor devices. There is a \$5 buyout fee at the conclusion of the program. This clears the data and transfers ownership of the device to the student to use in a private capacity.



UNIFORM POLICY

A neat and tidy appearance shows pride in self and our school. We aim to provide excellent educational opportunities for all students in partnership with parents and we support their endeavours to make sure students are well dressed and presented in our uniform each day. Our Parents' & Citizens' Association (P&C) supports our Code of Dress, which aligns to the objectives of the Education (General Provisions) Act 2006. The school uniform is available to be purchased at school through **The School Locker** every Tuesday and Thursday from 7:30am-10:00am. The School Locker store is open 6 days a week at 3878 Pacific Highway, Loganholme. Our parent community is regularly consulted on school uniform matters through the P & C and the Beenleigh SHS Uniform policy and Dress code is reviewed annually.

There are numerous reasons for maintaining dress standards and promoting our school uniform which includes;

- To ensure student safety so that staff can identify enrolled students, staff and visitors within the school grounds
- To promote a positive image of the school within the Beenleigh community.
- To promote the link between dress standards, school discipline and a strong school culture.
- To nurture our school identity.
- To minimize the cost, to parents, of providing suitable clothes for school.
- To promote a fairness and equity for all students.

The formal school uniform is to be worn when representing the school in public such as excursions and community development activities unless stipulated.

Students may be excluded from certain school activities and external school- based activities:

- 1. If students wear clothing that does not align to the standards outlined in the uniform policy and has the potential to damage the reputation or image of the school across the broader community
- 2. If the health and safety of the student or other students, with regards to occupational health & safety legislation, would otherwise become compromised.
